Weekly Pick

This week's Pick is Marking Your Bible or Bible Journaling. There are many people who can't imagine ever writing in a book. That's a good idea if you're borrowing a book from the library or a friend, but otherwise it's your book! Write away! Even more people are horrified by the idea of writing in a Bible, but what better way is there to respond to God's Word, God's letter to his children, than to write back? Highlighting significant passages or verses you'd like to remember, noting key phrases that speak to you or explain a teaching of the Church, noting portions that correspond to particular paragraphs in the Catechism are all good reasons for Marking Your Bible. There are many ways to go about Marking Your Bible. Some people use a simple color coding system. Others get very artistic with detailed illustrations. Google "Bible Journaling" for examples. Use whatever skills are in your wheelhouse and work best for you. What to use? Look for good quality pencils and pens that are a dry media. Most Bibles are printed on gossamer thin paper that can bleed through even more than one page if you use markers or pens with wet ink. Do some research online to find some good suggestions. Even then, it's a good idea to test whatever you buy on any extra blank pages in the back of your Bible beforehand. It's also a good idea to write out a key to your highlighting system somewhere in your Bible so that you can be as consistent as possible, but even if it's not perfect, again, it's your Bible. Make it as simple or elaborate as you choose, always keeping in mind that knowing God's Word is the end goal, not how pretty you can make it. God has done that on his own. Marking Your Bible or Bible Journaling is another way grow closer to God through his Word.
