Something to Think About

February 25: Today's reading is one of the most moving stories in Sacred Scripture, Abraham's willingness to sacrifice Isaac. The reading is paired with the account of Jesus' transfiguration on the mountain, and foreshadows his passion, crucifixion and death on the cross.
