

STUDY BOOK OF JOHN SUMMER BIBLE STUDY IS STILL HAPPENING

It's on Thursday following the 9am mass, in the church library; and thereafter, weekly all summer. The study is informal- each week a chapter is read, discussed and written questions answered. You will enjoy studying JOHN which is very different from the synoptics; Matthew, Mark and Luke. It was the last Gospel written, (He had the last word), somewhere around 90/100 AD in Ephesus. The Thursday study takes between 45 and 60 Minutes. If you are not able to attend all the sessions you are welcome to attend as many sessions as your schedule allows. The discussion leader is Jere Briggs who has summered at his cabin on Balsam Lake for more than 48 years. He led the study of Román last summer. It is claimed by some Bible scholars that "people find themselves closer to God & to Jesus Christ in JOHN than any other book in the world." Why not attend and see if you agree. I would like to challenge you to study what God is telling us with JOHN's gospel.

This week's Pick is The Bread of Life Discourse. To start? Some simplified catechism regarding the lectionary calendar. The Roman Catholic lectionary calendar is divided into Sunday Cycles—Years A, B, and C—and Weekday Cycles—Years I and II, which determines the gospel that is the primary focus of that year. For instance, in Year A of the Sunday Cycle, we read primarily from the Gospel of Matthew. In Year B, the Gospel of Mark and Chapter 6 of the Gospel of John. And in Year C, the Gospel of Luke. John's Gospel is also read during Lent and the Easter Season in all three years. This year, we are in Year B of the Lectionary Cycle, which, as mentioned above, means that we are reading mostly from the Gospel of Mark and also Chapter 6 of the Gospel of John, which includes The Bread of Life Discourse. This is the time of the year when we enter into that phase of the lectionary calendar. It is an important part of the Sunday Cycle for the Catholic faith because it is the content and interpretation of this chapter of the Bible that sets us apart from other Christian denominations. That is because we believe that when Jesus teaches about the Eucharist in this chapter, he speaks literally about what the Bread and Wine truly become—his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Jesus reveals that he becomes truly present in the Eucharist. The reading of John 6 begins on July 29, the 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time, with the Feeding of the Five Thousand (John 6:1-15) and continues next week and throughout the rest of the month of August. While it's always a good practice, this is an especially critical time of the year to spend some time with the week's scripture passages prior to Mass. What to look for? Every section of John 6 is important in our understanding of the Eucharist—Jesus' bold statements about what it means, about him and for us—but pay particular attention to how Jesus responds when some of his disciples start to leave at the end of the chapter because they are shocked by what Jesus has said. Rather than call them back to explain that he was only speaking symbolically, he lets them walk away he holds his ground. August, the month of The Bread of Life Discourse in the liturgical cycle.
