



# **Pastor's Notes**



I wonder if Luke had tongue in cheek when he wrote the conclusion to his description of John the Baptist. Luke recounts John's less than diplomatic practice of calling his audience a bunch of snakes and his allegation that they were no more pious than a pile of rocks. He tells us that John

demanded that people empty their closets for the poor and quit their most lucrative and self-aggrandizing practices. He went on to tell them that the world was about to be judged by its maker. Luke closes that extraordinary scene saying that all this was typical of how John preached the "good news." From Luke's picture, it seems that although John made clear demands on everybody, the poor got the worst of it. John told them to give away every stitch of clothing they weren't wearing at the moment, along with any dessert they had saved for later. The others, tax collectors and soldiers, got away with being told to start being honest and stop acting like bullies. How was that good news?

# **Cluster Happenings**

# This week's Pick is Goodbye and God Bless.

Since the Spring of 2011, I have been writing a small column for the bulletin, it has been such a wonderful grace and blessing—and a terrific opportunity to learn more about God and our Catholic Faith. Unfortunately, the time has come to let someone else take over or, perhaps better yet, something new take its place. You ask why; I was diagnosed with Multiple Myeloma, a cancer of the plasma cells in the bone marrow, and now, seven years later, the cancer has progressed so that I can no longer use the energy, or more accurately summon and clarify my thoughts, well enough to continue. There are many difficulties (how I could go on!) that come with cancer, and giving up, one by one, the things that you love to do is one of them. Some see this as a loss—at times I do too—but I've tried to see it as a steady refinement of the person God intends me to be. Believe it or not, there are also many other blessings to having cancer as well. You begin to find out some real truths about yourself, especially as your relationship with the Lord grows. You're blessed with seeing the selfless side of family, friends, and even strangers and especially that of a spouse and child who stick with you when the times get tough. And as odd as it may sound, even though you are progressing to what will likely be an earlier end than you may have planned—as though you're the one who's in charge of making that call—vou're much more aware of the blessings of each day as they come. Best of all, if you choose to do so, you can become much more closely united to Christ. After all, who knows more about suffering, and suffering in faith, hope, and joy than God-made-Man.

As long as I've been given this last opportunity to publicly voice my thoughts, I guess I would choose two things to share. One is that I would not like to be remembered as someone who "fought" cancer. That phrase often pops up when people describe cancer. It's a "battle." A "fight." No. Cancer is a cross. We all have our crosses. As Christians, we are taught not to fight our cross, but to embrace it. We are asked to carry it, to learn from it—and to put on Christ along the way.

Admittedly, I have often wanted to lay my particular cross aside. I have wondered what good can come from it? And I have oh so often wished that my cross had not become part of the cross that those I love have also had to carry. But I have not "fought" in a battle with cancer, and my cancer is not what "wins" or what should ultimately get the power to define what my life has been. The life God granted is not necessarily a battle to be fought, with the exception of fighting against evil, but a joyful ful-fillment of whom we are to become.

And that brings me to the second thing I would share, and that is how we think about what our life means—what we would call a successful life. Trust me. No one is going to look at my life and see, with the eyes of the world, that I accomplished big, important things. You know, those things you dream about when you're very young. I never wrote the great American novel. I never became an accomplished—or, to be honest, even a very good pianist. I never had a career or earned a lot of money. But I have learned, that while that can all be exceptional, and how wonderful for all of us that there are people for whom those dreams come true, because we all benefit from their gift, ultimately, it doesn't really matter if that's not what happens for most of us. It's not the most important thing. What does matter, what is important, is that I loved and was loved. I was drawn to know God. I have learned that life is all about preparing for the day that we die and come face to face with God, and I have learned that when that time comes, it doesn't matter so much what I've accomplished. What matters is what I've been able, through God's grace, to do for others and what has been done for me through the love and mercy of Jesus Christ.

So again, thank you if you've read any of my writings over the last several years. I hope that something you've read here has inspired you to learn more about this faith we all love. It's been a great pleasure and honor to do so.. Let your own journey to God, whenever or however that comes, be one of firsts and not lasts, beginnings and not endings. And I would hope that now that you know our story, you would not treat us any differently than you did before you knew, for we are all on this very same journey together. We are all traveling this same road to eternity. So, Goodbye and God Bless. Kathy Long
